CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 5

PROPOSED BY THE 86TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY

(FIRST REGULAR SESSION)

ALLOWS CITIES, TOWNS, VILLAGES, COUNTIES AND SCHOOL DISTRICTS, SUBJECT TO VOTER APPROVAL, TO INCREASE THEIR BONDED INDEBTEDNESS BY FIVE PERCENT OF THE VALUE OF TAXABLE TANGIBLE PROPERTY TO RETROFIT PUBLIC BUILDINGS TO WITHSTAND EARTHQUAKES. THERE WOULD BE NO DIRECT COST. INDIRECT COSTS WOULD DEPEND UPON VOTER APPROVAL IN CITIES, TOWNS, VILLAGES, COUNTIES, SCHOOL DISTRICTS, CORPORATIONS AND OTHER POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 7

PROPOSED BY THE 86TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY

(SECOND REGULAR SESSION)

SCHOOL DISTRICTS, CITY AND COUNTY GOVERNING BODIES MAY ADOPT PROPERTY TAX PROPERTY TAX RATES AUTHORIZED IN THIS SECTION BY MAJORITY VOTE. CHANGES AUTHORIZED RATE FOR SCHOOL DISTRICTS FROM \$1.25 TO \$2.00 PER ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS ASSESSED VALUATION. COSTS DEPEND ON ACTIONS OF LOCAL GOVERNING BODIES OR VOTERS. RAISES MAXIMUM TAX LEVY SCHOOL DISTRICTS COULD ADOPT WITHOUT A VOTE AND RAISES THE MAXIMUM LEVY WHICH COULD BE ADOPTED WITH A SIMPLE MAJORITY VOTE.

PROPOSED BY THE 86TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY

(SECOND REGULAR SESSION)

BEGINNING JULY 1, 1994, TRANSFER FIVE PERCENT OF NEW MOTOR FUEL TAX REVENUES FROM STATE ROAD PROJECTS TO THE VARIOUS COUNTIES AND ST. LOUIS CITY, IN ADDITION TO THE \$10,000,00 PER YEAR BY 1997 IN ROAD FUNDS WOULD SHIFT FROM THE STATE TO COUNTIES AND THE CITY OF ST. LOUIS.
