**CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT No. 3**

Proposed by the 88<sup>th</sup> General Assembly (First Regular Session)

Shall there be an annual transfer of a percentage of the funds in the general revenue fund to the "Facilities Maintenance Reserve Fund" for the purpose of maintenance, repair and renovation of state facilities? This proposal would result in the transfer of approximately \$5,400,000 from the General Revenue Fund to the Facilities Maintenance Reserve Fund. No impact to local governments.

**CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 5**

Proposed by the 88<sup>th</sup> General Assembly (Second Regular Session)

Shall the constitution of the state of Missouri be amended to create a state department of aging within the executive branch of state government? State administrative costs to implement this proposal are unknown but subject to state appropriations. No local costs are anticipated.

**CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 6**

Proposed by the 88<sup>th</sup> General Assembly (Second Regular Session)

Shall municipalities, upon voter approval, be authorized to issue bonds to build revenue producing sewer treatment plants and shall water plants be removed from regulation as a public utility? The proposal would have no fiscal impact on state government. Its impact on local government would depend upon actions of local voters.

**CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 7**

Proposed by the 88<sup>th</sup> General Assembly (Second Regular Session)

Shall a "Budget Stabilization Fund", also known as the "rainy day fund" be created in the state treasury to provide an operating reserve in years where revenue projections are below expectations? This proposal would not directly affect any state or local taxes. State funds could be redistributed.

**CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 8 - Proposed by Initiative Petition**

Shall Article IV Sections 47(a), 47(b) and 47(c) of the Missouri Constitution be amended to extend for ten years the sales and use tax of one-tenth of one percent for use in accordance with state law by the Department of Natural Resources for soil and water conservation and for the acquisition, development, maintenance, and operation of state parks and historic sites and for payments in lieu of real property taxes for land acquired by the state for park purposes? The ten year sales tax extension would raise approximately \$70 million annually to halt soil erosion and continue to maintain state parks. No tax increase.

**CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 9**

Proposed by Initiative Petition

Shall Article VIII of the Missouri Constitution be amended to provide that Missourians intend this initiative lead to adoption of an amendment to the United States Constitution establishing Congressional term limits and further amend Article VIII to provide the Secretary of State shall determine and inform voters on election ballots whether candidates for Congress support Congressional term limits by printing adjacent to incumbent candidates who failed to support Congressional term limits "DISREGARDED VOTERS' INSTRUCTION ON TERM LIMITS" and printing adjacent to non-incumbent candidates who refuse to take a term limits pledge "DECLINED TO PLEDGE TO SUPPORT TERM LIMITS?"

The taxpayers of Missouri will have costs of over \$40,000 per year to track records of candidates and county election authorities will have increased costs for printing ballots. Does not include costs of possible litigation.

**STATUTORY MEASURE - PROPOSITION A - Proposed by Initiative Petition**

Shall Sections 290.500 and 290.502, RSMo 1994 be amended to: require all employers, except as otherwise provided in Sections 290.500 and 290.530, RSMo 1994, to pay their employees an hourly minimum wage of no less than \$6.25 as of January 1, 1997; \$6.50 as of January 1, 1998; \$6.75 as of January 1, 1999; and beginning January 1, 2000, an additional fifteen cents per year thereafter; expand the statutory definition of "employee"; permit the legislature or any municipality to raise or expand minimum wage coverage; and provide for severability of any provision or application of the measure held invalid? Total state administrative costs will rise in excess of \$100,000,000 annually by 2000. Local government costs are expected to rise in excess of \$1,000,000 annually.

**COMMISSION FOR THE HANDICAPPED - PROPOSITION H**

Shall Jefferson County establish, improve, and maintain sheltered workshops, residence facilities and related services for developmentally disabled and handicapped persons, and for which the county shall levy an additional tax of five cents (\$.05) for each one hundred dollars (\$100) assessed valuation thereof? If approved, the total levy will be fifteen cents (\$.15) for each one hundred dollars (\$100) assessed valuation.

**WINDSOR C-1 SCHOOL DISTRICT - PROPOSITION**

Shall the School Board of Windsor C-1 School District be authorized to increase the tax levy for operational and instructional purposes by fifty cents (\$.50) on one hundred dollars assessed valuation? If this proposition is approved by the voters, the total operating levy ceiling (before Proposition C rollback) of the school district will be four dollars and 15/100 (\$4.15) per one hundred dollars of assessed valuation.

**HILLSBORO R-III SCHOOL DISTRICT - PROPOSITION R-3**

Shall the Board of Education of the Hillsboro R-III School District of Jefferson County, Missouri be authorized each year to eliminate the rollback in the operating levy required under Section 164.013, RSMo, for the purposes of, but not limited to, the acquisition, construction, equipping and furnishing of additional classrooms to the high school, middle school, and junior high school; technology improvements District wide; and remodeling and repair improvements to existing facilities of the District?

(Approval of this proposition would permit the district to receive the full benefit of the state one-cent sales tax for education without reducing its operating levy.)

**SUNRISE R-9 SCHOOL DISTRICT - PROPOSITION 1**

Shall the Board of Education of the Sunrise R-IX School District, Missouri, borrow money in an amount not to exceed One Million One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$1,150,000) for the purpose of constructing, equipping, furnishing, and betterment of school facilities including, without limitation, the constructing, equipping, and furnishing of additional classrooms, library-media center, computer laboratory, and the renovation, remodeling, and repairs to existing facilities of the District and other improvements, and issue bonds for the payment thereof?

**CITY OF FESTUS - PROPOSITION**

Shall the City of Festus reduce the Municipal Tax Levies for general and special revenue purposes from \$0.72 on each \$100 assessed valuation to \$0.45 on each \$100 assessed valuation (a reduction of 39%) upon the imposition of a sales tax of ¼ of One percent (1%) on the receipts from sale at retail of all tangible personal property or taxable services within the City limits of the City of Festus, Missouri, if such property and taxable services are subject to taxation by the State of Missouri under the provision of Chapter 144.525, RSMo. 1995, as amended, for the purpose of providing funding for storm water control and local parks for the City of Festus; and upon the imposition of said sales tax there?

Shall the Board of Directors of the Pacific Fire Protection District, Missouri, borrow money in an amount not to exceed Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) for the purpose of providing funds for the acquisition, construction, equipping and improvement of (1) a new fire station, (2) additional facilities at Fire Station No. 2 including two new bays, a training room and storage facilities, and (3) additional facilities at Fire Station No. 3 including an exhaust system and an emergency phone system, and issue bonds for the payment thereof?
